

LYNNE STOCKWELL ENDOWMENT FUND AT OHIO STATE

The Lynne Murray Stockwell Memorial Scholarship Fund was established in 2004 with gift(s) from family members and friends of Lynne Murray Stockwell and the Middle Tennessee Alumni Association. This fund provides merit-based scholarships to deserving freshmen students from Middle Tennessee who are in the top 25% of their class. The scholarships are awarded annually and each scholarship is renewable for four years. Prospective recipients are interviewed, ranked and recommended by the Middle Tennessee Alumni Association Scholarship Committee or the Ohio State Alumni Association.

The endowment fund is growing. As of June 30, 2005, the balance is over \$51,500. Our level of giving is keeping pace with the scholarship commitment of awarding a 4 year scholarship of \$1000 per year to a deserving Middle Tennessee rising freshman. We will again this year celebrate Lynne's life and devotion to The Ohio State University by awarding the 2005 Lynne Murray Stockwell Scholarship Award to a deserving Middle Tennessee Student at the kickoff party at Embassy Suites in Cool Springs September 3rd.

CLUB AWARDS 2005 SCHOLARSHIPS

Aaron Horner, Franklin High School, is the 2005 Lynne Murray Stockwell Scholarship recipient. He is an outstanding student who plans to major in chemical engineering. The Stockwell is a \$1000 scholarship, which is renewable for 4 years up to \$4,000.

Christopher Morey is the Alumni Scholars Program Scholarship recipient. It is a \$600 award that is funded by the Alumni Association at Ohio state. He also is an outstanding student, intends to be in Naval ROTC at OSU, and will major in chemistry. Both the Stockwell and the ASP require 3.0 GPAs.

Patrick Bradley will receive a Middle Tn OSU Alumni Club "Scarlet and Gray" award scholarship of \$600. These scholarships are fully funded by our club and given at the discretion of the scholarship committee.

Erin Hutfilz of Beech High School, our first Stockwell recipient in 2004, is majoring in Dance. She is doing very well at Ohio State and her award will be renewed for her sophomore year. Last year we also awarded club scholarships to upperclassmen, Lauren Stafford and Mary Katherine Davidson. Both had been previous recipients and have been very successful at Ohio State academically and in extra-curricular and service pursuits. Another past recipient is Jeff Zelek, who graduated magna cum laude in civil engineering in 2005 and is working for Centennial Contractors in Fairfax, VA. He has already gotten involved in the Washington, DC area Ohio State alumni club.
